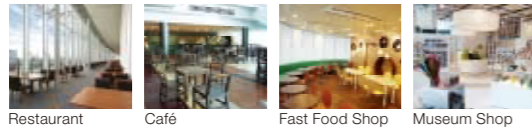

🚌 Free Bus

Between the hours of 11:00 and 20:00, a free bus runs every 15-25 minutes between the major facilities of Odaiba (the bus stop is located near the staff entrance to the left after exiting Miraikan).

Visitors who purchased an admission ticket at the entrance can print an admission ticket at the Dome ticket machine (first-come, first-served; one ticket per visitor).

👶 Small Children

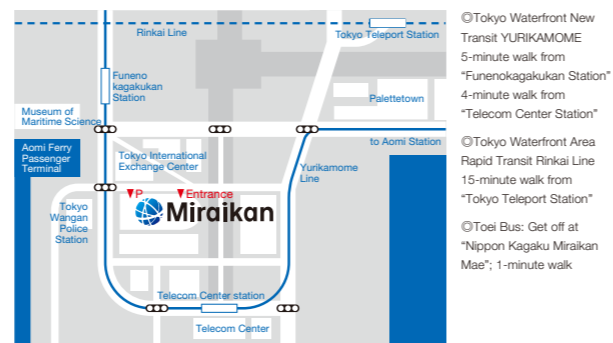
Baby strollers are available at the 1F Service Counter. "Baby's Café" (nursing room) is located at the back of the 5F café.

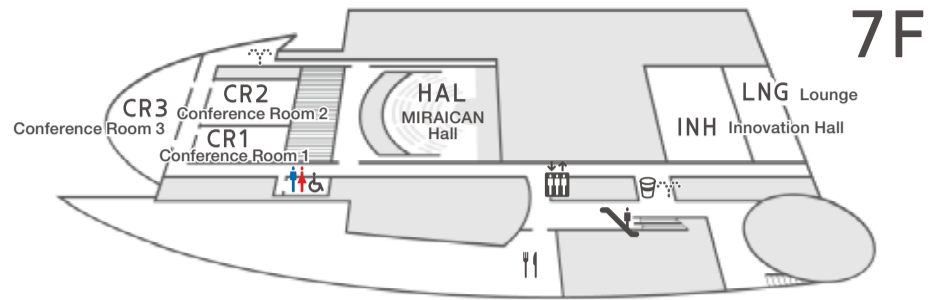

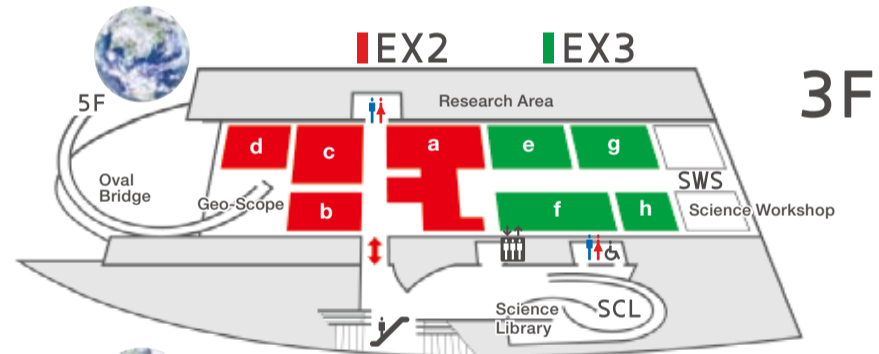
