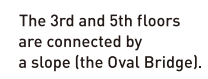

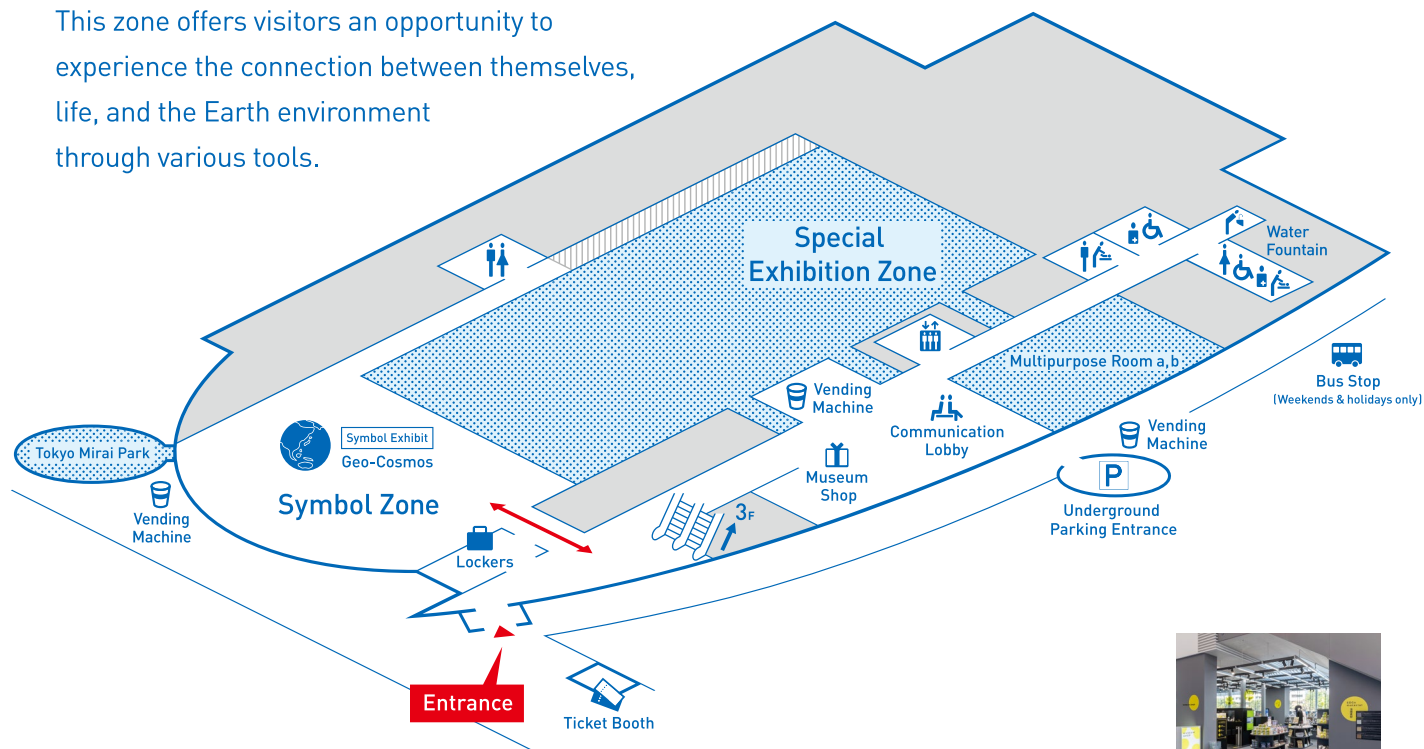

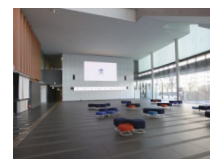

A 6-meter-diameter sphere of Earth. It uses satellite data to show the ever-changing state of the planet. A variety of contents is also shown on this spherical display.

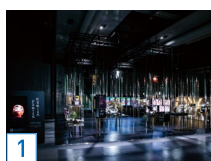
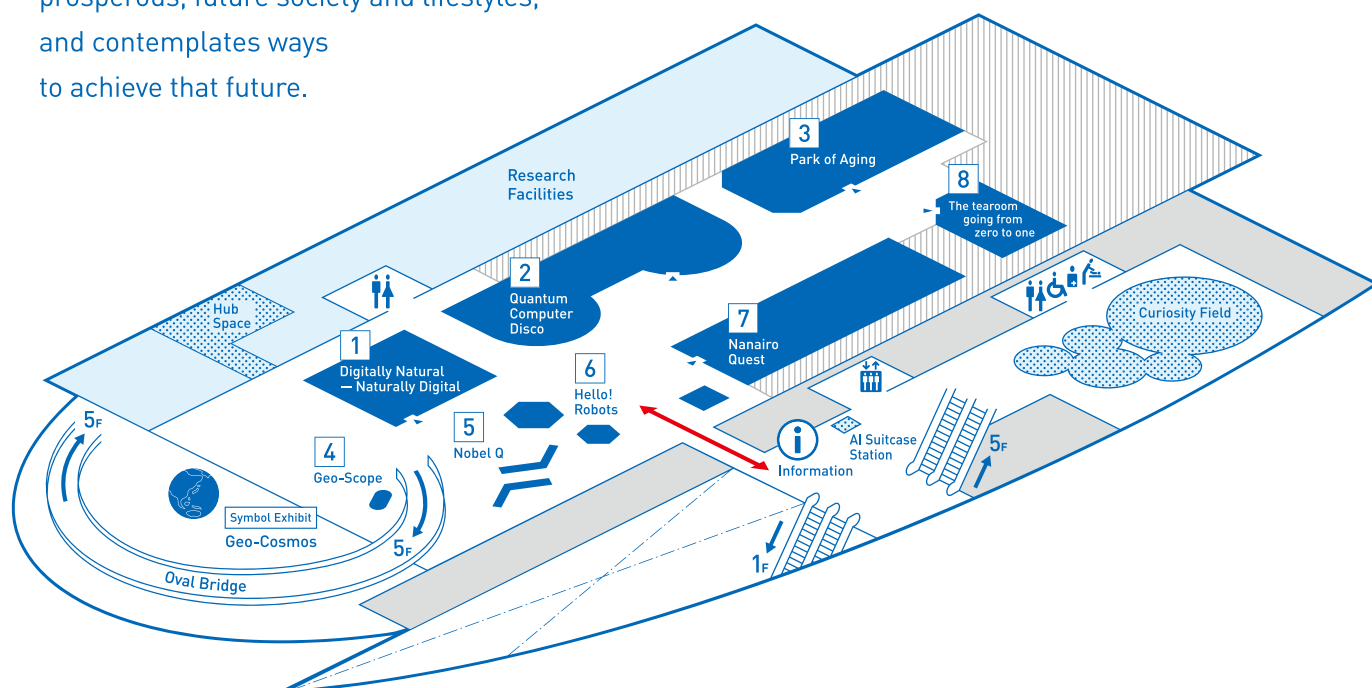
